There is no meaningful difference between the concepts of ethics and morality, but I'll explain why you should choose one word or the other. A. Descriptive Ethics or Morals: a study of human behavior as a consequence of beliefs about what is right or wrong, or good or bad, insofar as that behavior is.

Values are rules. Morals are how we judge others. Ethics are professional standards.

Morality v Ethics in Society Many people bristle at the word morality but are quite comfortable using the term ethical, and insist there's some. The basis for ethics must be morals, not the other way around. Morals. Morals are the prevailing standards of behavior that enable people to live cooperatively in groups. Moral refers to what societies sanction as right and. Morals are what you have been taught; so they are passed down from one generation to another. One person's morals may differ from another as parents taught.

Morals are the principles on which one's judgments of right and wrong are based. Ethics are principles of right conduct. So the two nouns are.

So a conversation about ethical and moral decision-making is important. But problems arise when the terms ethics or morals are used. Many people use Morals and Ethics interchangeably and for good reason; if you look up the definition of morals it will reference ethics in a somewhat circular.
